

HOW TO:

Join up text in Inkscape

- Open up Inkscape from the bar at the bottom of your screen
- To start, click on the Text Tool in sidebar
- Click on your blank page and type a word
- Go to the Text menu and select Text and Font

The font menu will appear on the right hand side.

- Scroll through the fonts and pick 'Tartine Script' click Apply.
- Click the black arrow this is your selection tool. Click on your word to select it.
- In the menu, click Path and then Object to Path.
- 8. Click Object => Fill and Stroke.
- Click on Stroke Paint and click Flat Colour - this puts an outline on your text.
- 10.Click on Stroke Style and set the width to 0.1 mm - this sets up your word to be cut out on the lasercutter.



- 11. Then click on the Fill tab, a select **No Paint.**
- 12. Making sure your word is still selected, click **Object** then **Ungroup**.
- 13. Click anywhere on the page so your whole word is deselected.
- 14. Now click on a letter and and move it so it overlaps the letter next to it.
- 15. Do this with all the letters until they all overlap slightly.
- 16. Using the **selection tool**, click and drag over your whole word to select all the letters.
- 17. Click **Path and Union** to join all the shapes together.

Now your word is ready to cut or use in as part of another design!
